He was killed in an intelligence-  
based operation in Sambaza, Zhob,

### Digital Nation Pakistan Bill

The National Assembly also passed the Digital  
Nation Pakistan Bill, with the declared objective of  
transforming Pakistan into a digitally empowered  
nation by fostering a dynamic digital society, a  
robust digital economy, and efficient digital govern-  
ance.

The bill seeks to establish three bodies: the  
National Digital Commission (NDC), Strategic  
Oversight Committee (SOC) and the Pakistan  
Digital Authority (PDA)

The NDC, chaired by the prime minister and com-  
prising federal and provincial leadership, will set  
the strategic vision and policy framework for the  
country’s digital transformation.

The PDA will implement these policies by coordi-  
nating and harmonising digital initiatives across all  
levels of government, and the SOC will monitor the  
PDA’s performance and provide an independent  
review to the NDC, ensuring alignment with the  
master plan.

Meanwhile, President Asif Ali Zardari has sum-  
moned a joint session of parliament today (Friday)  
at 10am. The session will address bills that were passed  
by one house, but are pending approval in the other.
